



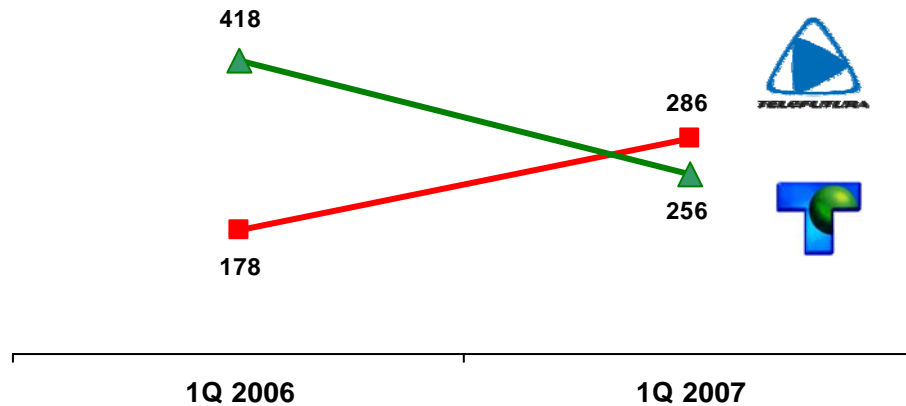

FOR FIRST TIME EVER, TELEFUTURA IS #2 NETWORK FOR AN ENTIRE QUARTER IN PRIMETIME AND TOTAL DAY AMONG HISPANIC ADULTS 18-34

MIAMI, FL, April 10, 2007 – For the very first time, TeleFutura reigned as America’s #2 Spanish-language network for an entire quarter in both Primetime and Total Day among Hispanic Adults 18-34. In first quarter 2007, TeleFutura not only achieved its highest ever first quarter performance in Primetime among Hispanic Adults 18-34, but also outdelivered Telemundo for the second consecutive quarter in Total Day among the key demo.

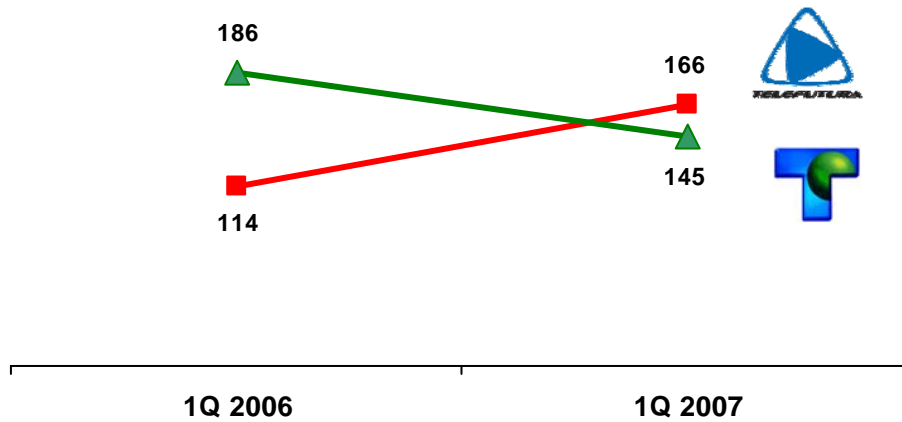
TeleFutura’s Primetime audience among Hispanic Adults 18-34 (286,000) grew an impressive +61% vs. a year ago while Telemundo’s audience (256,000) declined -39%.

Hispanic Adults 18-34 Audience (000)



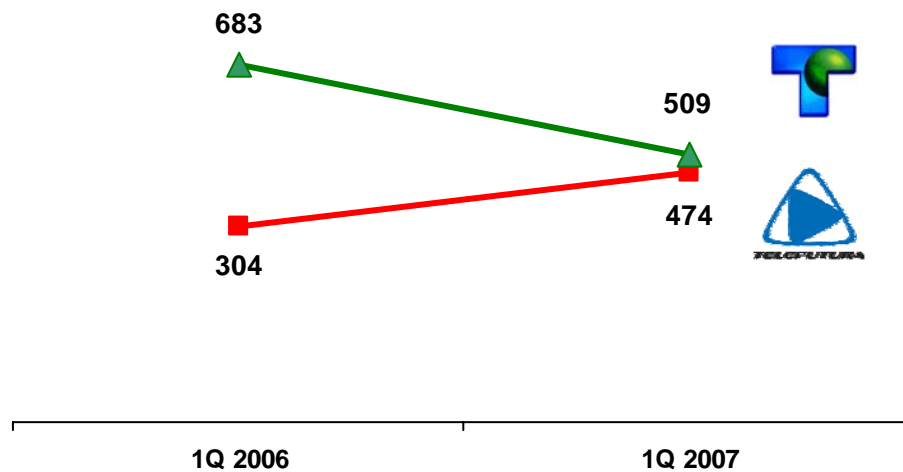
Year-to-year, TeleFutura achieved double-digit audience growth in Total Day among Hispanic Adults 18-34 (166,000, +41%), surpassing Telemundo’s audience (145,000), which suffered a decline (-22%).

TeleFutura also continued its double-digit audience growth momentum among Hispanic Adults 18-49 in first quarter 2007. In Primetime, TeleFutura delivered a record audience performance compared to any quarter, not just first quarter, in the network's history. TeleFutura's Primetime audience among Hispanic Adults 18-49 (474,000) grew +56% vs. a year ago, while Telemundo's audience (509,000) declined by -25%.

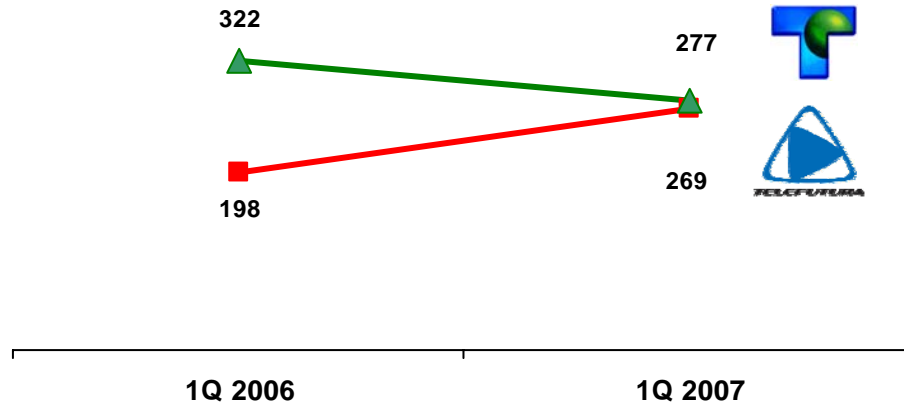
Primetime M-Sun 7pm-11pm

Year-to-year, TeleFutura also achieved audience growth in Total Day among Hispanic Adults 18-49 (269,000) and delivered significant growth (+41%), while Telemundo's audience (277,000) suffered a decline (-14%).
